## Zonta International and the United Nations

Zonta has General Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), consultative status with the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), participatory status with the Council of Europe, and special relationships with United Nations entities promoting women's rights. Zonta also maintains representatives at UN sites in Geneva, New York, Paris and Vienna.

## Zonta International programs funded through the Zonta International Foundation

Zonta International Foundation (ZIF), the official charitable foundation of Zonta International, advances and sustains Zonta's global service and advocacy programs. Through the Foundation, Zonta International helps women and girls overcome gender barriers to educational and professional advancement; provides opportunities for women to earn higher wages and achieve economic independence; ensures that women and children have access to quality, affordable health care; and strives to end violence against women while helping survivors rebuild their lives.

### International Service Program



The International Service Program focuses on projects that help women in developing countries improve their legal, political, economic, educational and health status. Since 1923, Zonta has provided more than US\$13 million to projects benefiting more than 2 million women in 36 countries.

### Zonta International Strategies to End Violence Against Women (ZISVAW)



Zonta International strives to promote and protect the human rights of all women and girls and reduce the incidence of violence against them. Since 2000, Zonta has provided more than US\$3.5 million to support 43 projects in 33 countries.

### Amelia Earhart Fellowships



The Amelia Earhart Fellowship is awarded annually to women pursuing Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace-related sciences and aerospace-related engineering. Since 1938, Zonta has awarded 1,473 Fellowships, totaling more than US\$9 million, to women representing 70 countries.

### Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships



The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship program provides financial support to women pursuing undergraduate or Master's degrees in business management. Since 1998, Zonta has awarded 335 Scholarships to women from 50 countries.

### Young Women in Public Affairs Awards



The Young Women in Public Affairs Award program recognizes young women for their demonstrated leadership skills and commitment to public service and civic causes. Since 1990, Zonta has presented 763 Awards, totaling US\$690,000, to 661 young women from 53 countries.
