1. Our "hands on" project is our service to the Coats for Kids. As a club, we gather and make pies to be used at our bazaar and also sold as whole pies. The funds we raise with this project is used to purchase Coats for Kids (ages 0-18). Letters are sent to daycares, schools and other agencies (Child and Family Services, Churches) to make them aware of our project. Last year 27 coats were given to children 0-18. Currently we have over 75 coats available and of those 75—10 were donated by a community member.
2. For service, we have also donated to the Foster Care program, selecting children who are in foster care and purchasing gifts for Christmas. This year we also purchased gift cards to be given to clients involved in the Health Department Home Health Program, to give them the opportunity to purchase additional groceries for their holiday enjoyment.
3. A request was received from a local woman who was unable to purchase eyeglasses for herself. Due to special eye care needs, her glasses were too expensive for her to purchase on her own and she needed them for work. A donation was made on her behalf to the eye clinic she was involved with to help with the purchase of the glasses.
4. Helping serve the meal at the Christmas Dinner, sponsored by the Community was also a project of Glendive Zonta, in addition a monetary donation was made to help with the purchase supplies for the dinner.
