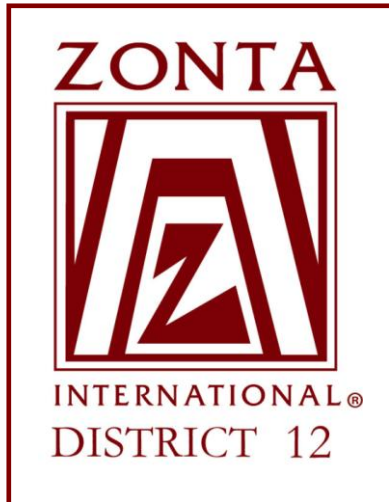

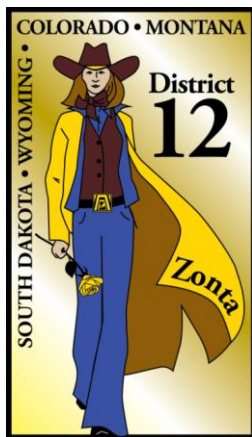

It has been a busy summer and fall in the Zonta world. The 2012 Zonta International Convention was held in Torino, Italy last July. Thirty-two women from our district were in attendance, and many of us toured around Italy and the surrounding countries before and after the convention. You will see several articles in this newsletter written by attendees who will attest to the fact that we had a lively and educational week or two in Europe! The election results and all of the presentations are posted on the 2012 Zonta International Convention web site in the Latest News section under the More News link. Seven international directors were elected at the convention, and one of them is our new district liaison, Joy Orlich. You will see a short biography about her later in this newsletter. The role of the international liaison is to be an interface person between the district governor and the Zonta International president. Her role is to assist the district with questions and issues that may arise, and to provide any support necessary for us to be successful during this biennium. She will also be attending our district conference in 2013.



The first ever District 12 Governor's Seminar was held on September 21st - 23rd in Denver. The program included both informative and thought-provoking presentations along with breakout sessions and time to socialize and catch up with District 12 friends. ### ***Meet Joy Orlich, District 12 International Liaison Zonta International Director 2012-14***

Joy is the Finance/Grants Manager for the Northern Nevada International Center, a non-profit organization working with the U.S. State Department to bring emerging leaders from around the world to the U.S. for business and cultural exchange programs. The International Center hosts about 250-300 visitors a year.

Joy's career has been divided between private industry, government, and the non-profit sector, working in such diverse fields as banking, hospitality, gaming, public utilities, an international training company and a variety of non-profits ranging from youth and adult fitness to animal welfare to her current work at the International Center. Her professional responsibilities include finance, accounting, training, workforce development, and public speaking.

Joy joined the Zonta Club of Greater Reno, NV as a charter member in 1992. She saw Zonta as a natural extension of her international interests and a growing desire to help other women. Within a few years she became president, eventually moving up to Governor of District 9 from 2002-2004, then District Foundation Ambassador from 2004-2008. In 2003 she helped found the Zonta North American Inter-District Meeting, serving as a presenter in 2003 and 2007 and as co-chair in 2011. In 2011 Joy was also named to the ZI Foundation Development Committee.

Over the years she's been involved in many community organizations as a volunteer or board member, most recently as the immediate past president of the local chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, and an on-air volunteer fundraiser for the local public television station. In her spare time, Joy enjoys gardening, growing orchids, cooking, hiking, travel, good wine and conversation with interesting friends.

As an International Director, Joy hopes to raise the level of excitement and passion for our **international service projects and scholarship programs**, and also to serve as a role model in encouraging more young women to seek out leadership opportunities in Zonta.

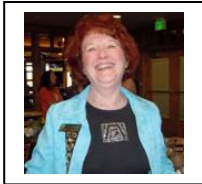




The convention in Torino was wonderful, just like all International conventions. Just the word international explains a lot of the wonder.

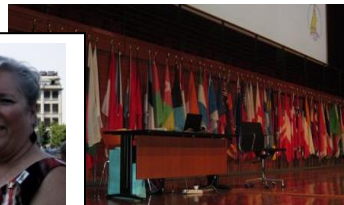

Hi I am Janet Bergin, Area 4 Director from the Zonta Club of Royal Gorge. Our area is busy, busy, busy!

In October, the Prowers County Club partnered with Domestic Safety and Lamar Public Library and presented a proclamation at the Lamar City Council meeting in support of Domestic Violence Awareness month.

Their local, yearly fundraiser for scholarships, the 2013 calendar planners, will be delivered to advertisers during November.

In partnership with the local public library, the Prowers County Club has begun the planning stages for a Chautauquan, Amelia Earhart, to come and do a program in January - information to follow.

In September, the Royal Gorge Club hosted a Luncheon & Roundtable: ***Slipping through the Cracks, Women and Girls of Fremont County***. The event brought together many of the service providers and organizations in our county to discuss the needs of women and girls. It gave the various organizations a chance to network with each other and exchange helpful information. The club's main goal of the event was to try to focus on a service project that would do the most good in the area. What we discovered is that our area has many overwhelming needs from housing and transportation to healthy relationship education and violence prevention. To narrow down the search we have picked a few organizations to give presentations at our monthly meetings on possible partnerships.

In October, the Pikes Peak Club hosted the Human Trafficking Awareness Symposium. The mission of the Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado is to build a collaboration of organizations and individuals to reduce human suffering caused by human trafficking, through advocacy, awareness, rehabilitation, and services for survivors.

In October, the Royal Gorge Club had their 13th Annual Artful Women Exhibition fundraiser. They presented their 2012 Sharon Cushman Memorial Scholarship winner with a check for \$1000 at the opening reception of the show.

**December 9:** Prowers County Club in Lamar, Zonta Holiday Home Tour, a fundraiser for the Domestic Safety Resource Center in Lamar, from 1:00-4:30. This event will provide support for the Zonta Cares toiletry and entertainment packages for women and children at the Domestic Safety Resource Center and local homeless shelter.

## International Service

Please take some time to consider the impact Zonta has on global projects enhancing the status of women. More details will come throughout the year, but for now, consider this excerpt from the 2012-2014 Biennium Goals of our Zonta International Board.

*"We are proposing to retain two international service projects - the Liberian fistula project and Rwanda's elimination of new pediatric HIV infection and prevention and response to survivors of domestic and gender-based violence - and are increasing the funding to 1 million USD for each project. Three ZISVAW projects are proposed with a combined value of 1,162,000 USD. They are a new Safe Cities for Women project in Honduras, empowering women in rural Samoa to combat violence, and a project in 12 Asian and African countries which uses **edutainment**, ... to transform the myth that violence against women is "normal" and "inevitable". Two of Zonta's education programs will benefit from additional funding from the Foundation. More international Young Women in Public Affairs Awards will be handed out (an increase from 5 to 10 international awards), and the value of these awards will increase from the current 3,000 USD to 4,000 USD. Winners of the international Jane M Klausman Women in Business Scholarships will receive 7,000 USD, an increase from the current 5,000 USD."* See the ZI web site for more information.

## Committee Reports



### **Advocacy/United Nations Chairman Jane Page, Zonta Club of Pierre/Fort Pierre**

#### ***District Zonta Advocacy Award***

It was exciting to announce the First Annual District Advocacy Award during the September District Governor's conference. This new award will be given each year in honor of the club whose advocacy project is chosen as the best in the district. Criteria for the award includes:

- How the projects coincides with the Zonta definition of advocacy
- How it reflects the D12 platform for advocacy issues;
- The percent of club members involved in the project;
- The impact of the project on advancing the status of women; and finally,
- How well the project is described in the club's annual report.



This year the award was presented to the **Zonta Club of Royal Gorge** for their "Take Back the Night Walk" project. Royal Gorge club members took part in walking Main Street in Cañon City to raise awareness and protest against sexual assault. The group then attended a rally where they were greeted with music and speakers covering sexual assault awareness issues. The community partner was the Family Crisis Services. Congratulations to the Royal Gorge Club for their award winning project.

#### **Foundation Ambassador**

It is exciting for me to be the D12 Foundation Ambassador for this 2012 -14 biennium. I appreciate all those who have stepped forward to be an ambassador for the ZI Foundation in our D12 clubs. It would be difficult not to be excited after attending the Convention in Torino where I met other District Ambassadors when attending a workshop on being an ambassador for the Foundation and after the Governor's Seminar in September.

- My goals for the coming two years skirttail on the goals for this biennium: credibility and visibility. They are:
- \* Every club will have an appointed ambassador who will receive a power point presentation on ZI's international projects and strategies and on our scholarships by Sept, 2012, to use in their clubs. These were sent out so I guess I am exhibiting credibility here.
  - \* Being visible means for me attending the Governor's Seminar, the 2013 District Conference and as many area meetings as possible during the biennium to present Foundation information. In November, I am presenting the power point on the new biennium projects to the Zonta Club of Boulder County and the Zonta Foothills Club of Boulder County.
  - \* Keep all clubs and board members informed every two months of what our district donations are for clubs and individuals.
  - \* Encourage donations by sending appreciation notes of thanks within a month of a donation being made.
  - \* To increase donations to the Foundation by 10% with 100% of our clubs contributing up to 1/3 of their fundraising dollars.



The Outreach gives me an opportunity to report to you how our individual and club donations look from June 1 to September 30, 2012. Individual donations from D12 to the Foundation was \$6,060 from 28 individuals out of 544 active members or 5% of our members...

**THIS IS GREAT...why?**

Last biennium at this time span in 2010, we had only donated \$1,525.00. Club donations during this period were \$15,587 from 8 clubs out of 21, or 38% of all the District clubs.

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**Archivist/Historian  
Barbara Pellegren, Zonta Club of Denver**

The District 12 Archivist/Historian committee will be carrying on the fun job of collecting and taking care of the history of District 12. One of our jobs is to begin looking for a good storage place for our records, and we will be looking for that space in libraries and colleges that will give us access to our records when we want it.

Another one of our tasks over the next two years will be to help ZI -Centennial Anniversary Chairman, Val Sarah, begin to prepare for Zonta's Centennial in 2019. Her committee has laid out action steps for each biennium.

- During 2012-2014 the Action Step is for all clubs to ensure appropriate storage of their archives and to create their club histories. Therefore, during this biennium the benchmarks for clubs are as follows:
  - o **Names of club historians/archivists sent to the District 12 archiving committee by January 1, 2013.**
  - o **Assurance – by May 1, 2013 - from club historians/archivists that appropriate storage has been found for the club histories; and that individual club histories are being worked on by club historians/archivists.**
  - o **Individual club histories sent in electronic file form to the District 12 Archiving committee by May 1, 2014.**
- During 2014-2016 the Action step is for districts is to ensure central storage of archives and to create a district history which will be submitted in some form to International.
- The 2016-2018 biennium is for International Action when an author begins working on ZI history, and planning continues for 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations in 2019.
- The final step, 2019-2020: During 2018 plans will be completed for 2019 celebrations; during 2019 – conducting the program of events; and during 2020 the history will be launched at that convention.

Most clubs have their history contained in something – a box, a book – or several books and boxes, but maybe it hasn't been well organized and easily accessed. We will be offering some training in this area **if** you tell us your club needs it. Maybe make the initial effort a group project - because it's fun to go back through all the pictures and programs generated by your club.

- **The first step is gathering all club records into one central place.**
- **The next step is to begin going through the records**, discarding all redundant paper (i.e. individual meeting minutes). A consolidation of information is what is important to keep. Begin with the club charter and work forward to present day:
  - culling monthly financial records, keeping only the last seven years of year-end financial reports, tax forms and audits.
  - keep all PR information including newspaper articles, pictures and awards.
  - keep all information regarding fundraising projects, including financial files, programs and planning notes.
  - all board minutes, annual reports, original by-laws and standing rule information, including all changes and additions – both the proposals and the results of elections regarding them.
  - all club directories from day one in both hard copy and electronic file.
  - all Foundation information (if your club has one), including planning, legal documents, board minutes and financial records.
  - Ideally, each president has collected an annual report from each of her committees and used those reports for her annual report. The committees' annual reports and the clubs' annual reports should be kept.
- **The third step is to begin writing your club's history** – Begin with an outline and include important information from each year. One of our District 12 club historians is planning to record conversations with her club's older members so that their valuable information is not lost. If you decide to do that also, you may include an interesting story or two from those members.
- **The last step for this biennium** is to forward a condensed version of your club's history to the District 12 Archivist/Historian.



**I would encourage you not to wait until Spring to begin this task as it may take more time than you think. In this case, it's never too soon to start!**

I am pleased to serve as your Jane M. Klausman Coordinator. One of my duties is facilitating the evaluation of the nominees from the District 12 clubs.

Jiwei Gu of Highlands Ranch, CO was named the recipient of the 2012 Zonta International District 12 Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship. Ms. Gu's application was one of **only five** applications submitted by clubs in District 12. The Zonta Club of Denver submitted her application. Four judges representing each of the four Areas chose Ms. Gu. A big thanks goes to these women!!!

The Zonta International Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships, first awarded in 1998, are open to women enrolled in at least the second year of an undergraduate program through the final year of a master's program in business, leading to a business management career. The program is designed to encourage women to enter careers and to seek leadership positions in business-related fields in their communities and throughout the world. The JMK Women in Business Scholarships look to the women of today to be the leaders of tomorrow.

Ms. Gu is a first-generation immigrant from China who came to the US five years ago. It is her goal to graduate from the University of Denver with both Finance and International Business majors along with a Business Ethics and Legal Studies minor. She is enthusiastic about getting into the financial industry and doing business internationally. Jiwei would like to find a niche in the market that will allow her to combine her legal and finance background in business.

Jiwei Gu, born and raised in China, also has a goal of gaining experience in the global business world to start a social enterprise that allows her to utilize her expertise to help end the **“lost girl’s”** tragedy in China and to get more girls in school in other Asian countries that have similar social issues. As one judge said, Ms. Gu “is an outstanding young woman with the intellect, talent and drive to succeed in business with the compassion and social skill to make a positive difference in the lives of girls and women globally.” **This is what Zonta is all about!**

Ms. Gu would like to take the LSAT prep course and she feels that she will be able to use these scholarship funds for that goal. She would also like to use these monies to take a course called “An Organized Walk Down Walk Street” which is a class that her current DU scholarships will not cover. Ms. Gu received the District 12 award during the banquet at the Governor’s Seminar on September 22. She received \$1,500 from Zonta International District 12 as well as another \$1,500 from the Zonta Club of Denver. Her application was submitted to Zonta International to compete for additional scholarship money, but unfortunately, she was not selected. We are pleased to award the Jane M. Klausman Scholarship to Jiwei!

My goals for this biennium are:

1. Increase awareness and participation from District 12 Club of the Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships from the current 5 Clubs to 10 Clubs during the biennium.
2. Coordinate with the Foundation Ambassador to solicit funds for Zonta International JMK Women in Business Scholarships. This will be accomplished by raising awareness and obtaining participation of 10 District 12 Clubs contributing to the JMK Women in Business Scholarship.

The 2012-2013 JMK Scholarship information will be available on the Zonta International web site after January 1, 2013. Nominees will be due to the District by July 1, 2013. I look forward to working with you!

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**Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) Coordinator

As a former educator, I am very happy to be chairing the District YWPA award committee this biennium. My role is to assist clubs in the management of this award and to receive all club nominations no later than April 1. I will then facilitate the selection of the district award winner and forward her nomination to ZI no later than May 1.

The goal of the Zonta International Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) Program is to encourage more young women to participate in public affairs by recognizing a commitment to the volunteer sector, evidence of volunteer leadership achievements and a dedication to the advancement of the status of women. My goals for our district reflect those of our Zonta International YWPA Chairman, Ute Scholz, Zonta Club of Verden, Germany, Past-Governor District 27 2008 – 2010.

THE MAIN GOALS OF THE INTERNATIONAL YWPA COMMITTEE in 2012 – 2014 are:

- An international nomination from every District, every year
- An increase in the number of clubs participating
- An increase in visibility via web site, social media and newsletter/mailings.

Ute believes that the YWPA has become more attractive and more important in every Zonta Club life. *“The YWPA Award is the most popular Zonta Award and clubs that take part in it tell me that they get a lot of public attention for their local Zonta Club and for Zonta International in general. And perhaps one day –when you keep in touch with the recipient - she will be the Zontian of tomorrow!”*

She wants to encourage all Zonta clubs to take part in the award. *“Just try it, even if you didn’t do it before! Start on a very low level; get contact to a school, to teachers. Have a look at the newspapers, if there are reports about young girls that are eligible. Even if you have only one or two candidates, just start it! Celebrate the club winner in a public ceremony with distinguished guests and local news agencies.”*

EXCITING NEW CHANGES in 2012 – 2014 include:

- An increase in the amount of the international award from \$3,000 to \$4,000

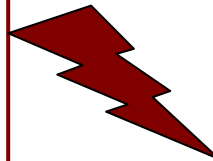
