Our three clubs have stayed busy with fundraising, advocacy, and service projects. Here are some highlights:

## **Pikes Peak Area**

The club inducted eight new members at its February meeting. The club has been focused on membership recruitment and retention.

The club successfully held their annual International Women's Day brunch celebration on Saturday, March 4th at the Pinery on the Hill in downtown Colorado Springs.

# **Prowers County**

The Embrace Your Potential workshop in the fall focused on Wellness for Women. This free seminar had an increase in participants from both the community and Zontians. Our Advocacy Committee did a great job during the 16 Days of Activism. Our Zonta Says No Banner hung from the Fire Department on Main Street and our Silent Witnesses were on display at the City Complex. The Holiday Home Tour raised more money over the previous year and funds were divided between the Domestic Safety Resource Center and the Care Net Pregnancy Center.

2017 is off to a good start. We added 6 new members and reinstated a member who had been out for a few years. In addition to planning the Area 4 meeting scheduled for April 7 & 8, the club celebrated Rose Day by selling and delivering yellow roses on March 8th and held our major Fundraiser, Girls Wanna Have Fun, March 25th.

# **Royal Gorge Area**

On Saturday February 11th, the club hosts its third annual One Billion Rising Event with a dance on the Royal Gorge Bridge to take a stand against violence against women. This is an International movement with the same dance being staged around the world around Valentine's Day. On March 18th, the club held an author's luncheon featuring Jill Tietjen, the author of Her Story who spoke at last year's Area 4 meeting. Everyone throughly enjoyed listening to Ms. Tietjen stories of amazing women in America's history.

On Amelia Earhart Day, the club hosted a mixer for potential new members to get to know more about the club and Zonta. From that event, we expect to gain three to five new members.

At Christmas the club gathered sweat suits that were donated to the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) department at the hospital. Since the clothes women were wearing at the time of the assault are taken for evidence, they often don't have anything to wear home. We have heard stories of how important these article of clothing are. One survivor's story that was shared with us by her mother, indicated that she kept the sweats as a reminder that there are people who care. The club also collected toiletries that were donated to Family Crisis and Rocky Mountain Behavioral, which assists women with addiction.

# **North East Colorado Coalition Against Trafficking**

In the final month of 2016, we spotlight the North East Colorado Coalition Against Trafficking (NECCAT). NECCAT was founded by a group of committed members of the Zonta Club-Greeley chapter in January of 2015. Zonta Vice President, Diana Laws, was a driving force in getting the group off the ground. As she explained it, Zonta's mission is to empower women through service and advocacy. The Greeley Zonta membership recognized that there were already several organizations addressing a variety of women's issues. But, Zonta believed it could address a gap by elevating the issue of human trafficking and its intersection with violence against women in their local community.

In less than two years of operation, 26 agencies—including area law enforcement and social service agencies—have joined the group. NECCAT sees its role as a convener of key stakeholders who have the experience and expertise to respond to cases of human trafficking. NECCAT also serves as a central repository for education and resources in the area. The group receives multiple requests for training on human trafficking and is able to enlist members to carry out education and outreach events based on their areas of specialization. Likewise, NECCAT has partnered with Zonta to raise funds to support human trafficking survivors. It has dedicated a portion of those funds to make survivor kits that include such things as basic toiletries and handmade socks. The kits benefit survivors immediately and support local law enforcement in their efforts to build rapport and a sense of safety among those they identify as potential trafficking victims. # A Zonta E-Club in District 12

Zonta District 12 is forming an e-Club this biennium and we're very excited to see it take off. The SOM Committee (Sponsor, Organize and Mentor) is comprised of leaders from throughout the District and includes Mary Kaiser, Jessica Larson and Andrea Hovey - Zonta Club of the Black Hills; Kelli Buscher - Zonta Club of Pierre-Ft. Pierre, and Deedee Boysen and Tasha Bauman of the Zonta Club of Laramie.

We will be using Zoom software to conduct the e-Meetings as well as our SOM Committee meetings, and SOM Committee members will begin training on how to use the software in March 2017. It is our hope to begin informational meetings with prospective members, using the Zoom software, beginning in May 2017. With luck and your help, we plan to charter the new e-club next Fall. All we need to do is identify 15 members for our new club, get them to complete a Prospective Member Form, and pay their dues. We can do this!

However, our best chance of making this work is if all members of the District help us to identify former Zontians or family members who might be interested in joining. E-Club members may live anywhere geographically. They operate like a traditional club in that they hold monthly meetings and complete service, advocacy and fundraising events in their own communities. To accomplish that goal, they identify broad areas of need that each member can address in his or her own community -- for example collecting items for a shelter. They can raise funds by holding a raffle or partner with like minded organizations in their community to collaboratively raise funds through an event that would benefit

both organizations. They could sell a Zonta item on their club website. And this is just the tip of the iceberg. E-Club members are also asked to hold an annual meeting in a face-to-face setting once a year. ZI recommends getting together at a District Conference, Governor's Seminar, Convention or InterDistrict Meeting, however, this is not a mandatory aspect of being an e-Club member. While recommended, this should not be a deal breaker when prospective members are considering joining.

In the month between now and May, the SOM Committee will be reaching out throughout the District to identify prospective members in addition to our training on the use of the software. Please take a moment now to consider your friends on Face Book who you knew in Zonta, but who have moved away from your club area, and family members who have been in Zonta or know about Zonta through you -- as these are exactly the people we want to enlist for our new e-Club. If you have people you would like to recommend, please e-mail Deedee Boysen at boysen.deedee@gmail.com. My recommendation is that you contact the past Zontians first so I don't surprise them, but that isn't necessary. I'm happy to make calls to whomever you recommend, no matter where they live in the US. Our goal is to have as many as possible future Zontians identified by May 1 so that we can get started. Even if that number is only 5, we will start our e-Club and build it up as we go.

Advocacy Update

## THE STEPS OF ADVOCACY: FROM PASSION TO ACTION

Advocacy is defined by Merriam Webster as the act or process of supporting a cause or proposal. *Just Say No! To Violence Against Women* continues to be a focal project of all Zontians. This project has been successful in raising awareness in many communities, which is a first step in making change to eliminate horrific acts of violence against women. This violence takes many forms ranging from genital mutilation to forced sex acts to domestic beatings. With awareness having been raised, now is the time to take the next steps to effectuate change. What is the best means to accomplish change?

Start at the local and state level. Our state legislatures are currently in session and a number of bills have been introduced to support victims of violence and stalking. The legislative proposals include, but are not limited to: broadening the definition of human trafficking; expanding victims' rights relative to the offenders' sentencing, probation, and parole; modifying sentencing laws; and modifying the definition of sexual assault. Although the legislative sessions are well underway, it is important to continue watching the proposed bills as they progress through the legislative process, and weigh in as necessary and/or appropriate. It is also not too early to begin thinking about additional legislation that may be needed. Discussions on proposed legislative changes should begin long before the sessions begin, in order to garner support from bill sponsors and other advocates.

Weigh in at the national level with a focus on specific issues and proposals. We are already hearing about proposed cuts in funding particularly important to women, particularly in the arena of health care. Many believe we are in an era where it will be difficult to advance women's issues, and thus, efforts should be spent trying to make sure that there isn't a regression of women's rights and assistance. Yet, there are additional efforts underway to breathe new life into the *Equal Rights Amendment*. So, be watchful and speak up! Just remember, Zonta is a non-partisan entity, and must remain so. While wearing your Zonta hat, focus on issues, not politics.

Finally, advocacy begins with a conversation about issues that peak our interest and enrage our senses. In this regard, two items have been prepared that are intended to be conversation starters. The informational flyers discuss the matters of *The Age of Marriage* and *The Age of Sexual Consent* in our District 12 region and are available on the District 12 website at <a href="http://zontadistrict12.org/what-we-do/advocacy-projects">http://zontadistrict12.org/what-we-do/advocacy-projects</a>. Take a look at these and become better informed about some

of the antiquated laws in place that allow for Child Marriages in our four states. Hopefully, this information will lead to some conversations that will peak your interest in protecting adolescent women from becoming victims as Child Brides or children who lose their innocence far too soon.
