Centennial Celebration - Honor and Empower

November 8, 2019 is our actual 100 year anniversary although celebrations have been taking place since mid 2018. Most clubs have appointed a Centennial Anniversary Chair, and most of the chairs regularly attend monthly meetings hosted by Kelly Christy, our Centennial Anniversary District Chair. One of the main benefits of having a representative on this committee is that we share ideas about how clubs will celebrate the centennial. These ideas cover a wide range of activities and events and include participation in parades, collaborative efforts with like-minded organizations to celebrate local women as well as amazing women throughout history, lighting up the state capitol dome on November 8th, working with local governments to develop proclamations, hosting banquets to celebrate local women... and the list goes on.

Governor's Centennial Celebration Tour. Lt. Governor Ann Hodgson and I would like to celebrate this marvelous time in our lives with as many clubs as we can between now and September 20, 2019, and possibly beyond. Our plan is to travel to clubs to take both photos and videos of your centennial celebrations and club members. In mid-August, we will create both a slide show and a video to share at the District 12 Conference so everyone can see the creativity that is afoot in our District. I already know of many of the clubs' plans through the Club Centennial Anniversary Chair meetings, and I look forward to seeing them come to life in your communities. If your club hasn't been participating in these Centennial Anniversary Chair Zoom meetings, you have really missed out on all the great ideas that are being shared. When we visit your club or event, Ann and I will present your club president with a certificate recognizing your club and event along with a donation to the Zonta International Centennial Anniversary Endowment Campaign. If clubs or club members would also like to make a donation to this fund or match the contribution Ann and I make, I would encourage you to do so when we visit. I look forward to meeting as many of you as I can! I'd also like to thank all of the club Centennial Anniversary

<u>Centennial Events</u>. I'd just like to be sure that everyone understands that the centennial events need to emphasize honoring and empowering women. This can happen at a fundraising event, a service event, an advocacy event or a membership event... or perhaps even at club meetings.

Centennial Anniversary Grants. There have been many questions about the grant and the online application for the grant. According to the *Guidelines for Clubs* that is available on the ZI website, the Centennial Anniversary Grants will be available to like-minded charity/not for profit organizations that partner with a Zonta Club to directly improve women's and girls' lives in your community. The program will increase the impact of the clubs' activities in your communities while also strengthening the link between Zonta's local and international levels and promoting the good name of Zonta at the local level. A club selects one project from a partnering organization, and the club submits an online application for the grant. Applications will be accepted from September 15, 2018 to March 31, 2019. This is a special program to honor Zonta's 100 years of service. The International Service Committee will review all applications after March 31, 2019 and pass their recommendations for projects to receive the grants to the Zonta International Board Executive Committee for final approval. The Zonta International Foundation Rose Fund provides the grant of up to \$5,000 each. The projects should be completed by March 31, 2020 to allow for timely communication before the end of the biennium and the 2020 Convention.

Several clubs in our District have already submitted applications, and it is my hope that each of your clubs will participate. I highly recommend finding and reading the guidelines for the grant before you invest the time in preparing the grant application. While not required, I would enjoy receiving a copy of your grant application or at least notification that you have submitted a grant, along with a brief summary of what your project will be and when it will take place. This is information I will need to provide to Zonta International so, please let me know when you submit your grant. Thank you.

<u>District-wide Common Action</u>. Many of you have heard that we are planning a common action on Tuesday, November 8, 2019. Zonta International has requested that this common action in some way incorporate the idea of ending child marriage and include a web/social media blast. Our plan is to "Light Up the Night" and raise awareness locally about ending child marriage. Lighting up the night is something all clubs can do. Some clubs are planning a candle-light vigil, some are working in their capitol to light up government buildings.... Be creative! The main idea is to tell your community about what Zonta is and what we care about. This does not need to cost your club any money. I would encourage all clubs to begin a conversation now about how your club will "Light Up the Night." I would definitely like to receive pictures of your event to share with Zonta International.

<u>Centennial Blog</u>. There is a blog on the <u>zonta100.org</u> website under 'News and Events' where clubs can share your club's story about your centennial event. Check it out and consider including your club's event.

<u>District Centennial Award</u>. All Districts have been asked to choose a recipient to receive recognition with a Centennial Award. The recipient could be either an individual or a local organization, just not a Zontian. I would like each club to start thinking about who our District could recognize at the District Conference. My thought is that each club could complete an application and then submit your candidates to me. I will identify a committee of District leaders to evaluate and choose our top candidates, from which one would be chosen. I do not have the application form completed yet, but hope to get it out to the Club Presidents very soon. These applications will require a fast turn-around, with a deadline of April 15, 2019 so that we can make our selection at our Board Summer Meeting in early June and invite the winner to our District Conference. Each club could also recognize their applicant at one of their club meetings. We will submit our District winner to the Zonta International North American Governors for consideration for the North American (Country) Centennial Award recognition. Each District will make one recommendation. Each Country will submit one winner to Zonta International for further recognition.

<u>2019 Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA)</u> – by Debbie Sundberg, D12 YWPA Coordinator I encourage each ZONTA club to honor someone from your area. You do NOT have to give Club money

leadership in her volunteer activities and is dedicated to empowering women in her community and worldwide. Women age 16-19 by April 1st are eligible.

HOW to GET STARTED: All applications must start at the Club Level.

- 1- Select a member or members to head up the YWPA committee.
- 2- Go to the ZONTA International website at www.zonta.org and get all the instructions and application forms. Or find them at foundation.zonta.org/YWPAAward. Some of the resources that you will find on the website include:
 - POSTER You can customize with your CLUB Info and Application Deadline. Scatter these
 throughout you community. Send letters to schools, counselors, churches and organizations to get
 awareness that ZONTA is sponsoring the Award
 - AWARD Selection Criteria
 - PROGRAM Background and Statistics
 - · YWPA GUIDELINES for Clubs and Districts
 - NEWS RELEASE Announcing the YWPA award Program
 - NEWS RELEASE Announcing your Club Winner of the YWPA Award
 - APPLICATION for 2019 including: Applicant Goals, Recommendation Forms with signatures, Verification of Current Enrollment by school or institution official or letter from employer stating employment, Application Cover Sheet signed by the Club President
- 3- APPLICATION DEADLINE to DISTRICT = April 1, 2019. One applicant per club. Applications are accepted by fax or mail; however, email submissions are preferred. All documents MUST be signed. Please be sure that the Club President COVER page is completed and signed.
- 4- Send your application to Debbie Sundberg, District 12 YWPA Coordinator.
- 5- DISTRICT evaluating committee reviews the club applications and selects one applicant per District to send to ZONTA International by May 1st. District winner receives \$1500 on behalf of District 12 from International and an additional \$500 from District 12 for a total of \$2000 plus an award certificate.
- 6- INTERNATIONAL YWPA committee recommends TEN international recipients from the District application to the ZONTA International Board. Each receives \$4000. After approval by the ZONTA International Board, the ZONTA International Foundation provides awards and certificates to the District and International Recipients by July 1st.

Women in Technology Scholarship - by Denise Luckhurst, D12 WIT Coordinator

During the ZI Convention in 2018, Zonta International announced a pilot of a new scholarship program aimed at women pursuing an IT degree or closely related program. Women not currently enrolled in a program, but meeting certain requirements, are also eligible.

The deadlines for submitting applications for the Women in Technology Scholarship have been announced by Zonta International.

District Deadline: August 1, 2019

• International Deadline: October 1, 2019


