On International Literacy Day each year, UNESCO reminds the international community of the status of literacy and adult learning globally.

Despite many and varied efforts, literacy remains an elusive target: some 774 million adults lack minimum literacy skills; one in five adults is still not literate and two-thirds of them are women; 72.1 million children are out-of-school and many more attend irregularly or drop out.

Of the approximately 25 issues, three of particular note included 1) revising the status of Women Service Committee by renaming and splitting responsibilities into Service and Legislative Awareness & Advocacy. 2) broadening Zonta membership qualifications; and 3) reaffirming ZI's support of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in celebration of the declaration's 60th anniversary. Another issue brought up involved increasing the amount of dues for Zonta International.

Dawn Tassler won the 50/50 drawing.

President Gustafson congratulated Alison Jares for receiving Zontian of the Year Award, as noted in our June 2008 Newsletter.

August 26 of each year is designated in the United States as **Women's Equality Day**.

Instituted by Rep. Bella Abzug and first established in 1971, the date commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment, the Woman Suffrage Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which gave U.S. women full voting rights, eighty-eight years ago, August 26, 1920.

Fast Facts


- In sub-Saharan Africa, 57% of adults with HIV are women and young women 15 to 24 are more than three times as likely to be infected as young men.
- Globally, more than 80% of women do not have sufficient knowledge about HIV/AIDS and many women do not have the power to say no to sex with an infected partner.
- Every year an estimated 4 million women and girls are bought and sold worldwide.
- In Bosnia, more than 10,000 victims of trafficking are in the country at one time.
- More than 59 million school-aged girls are not in school and female illiteracy rates remain higher than men.
- About 530,000 women die annually in pregnancy or during childbirth, mainly due to lack of access to health care.
