- Recycle used automotive batteries (the battery supplier you purchase your battery from should accept your used device)

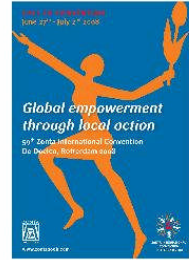
As we all know, any task is made lighter when it is shared, and any little bit of effort truly makes a difference. Hats off to you, and continue the good work!
