### **MINUTES of October 22, 2008**

The Zonta Club of Pierre-Fort Pierre held its monthly meeting at 12:00 p.m. on October 22, 2008, at the Pierre Masonic Temple. The call to order was made by President Laurie Gustafson; Carroll Forsch read The Collect.

Program: The speaker for the meeting was Secretary of State Chris Nelson. Chris talked about the Constitutional Amendment that gave women the right to vote. Chris iterated some of the same thoughts and discussions we had previously heard from Jo Riley and others about what was happening at the time, namely how the South Dakota constitution was changed giving women the right to vote two years before the US Constitution did so. For two years, women could vote in state elections but could not cast votes that would apply on a federal level. Chris was surprised by the number of times the nation's people were asked to consider giving women the right to vote. Some of the comments made by those who did not want to change the Constitution were laughable, but I am sure at the time they were said it was not funny at all. Chris then transitioned into a discussion on the four proposed Constitutional changes and three Initiated Measures that South Dakotans will be voting on in November's election.

In closing the discussion, Zontians posed a number of questions to Chris. His responses provided some great insight:

- Nelson expects the voter turnout to be very good predicts 75% turnout.
- The Secretary of State's office has seen an increase in voter registrations.

- A number of safeguards have been put in place in order to screen for voter registration fraud.
- Registration for those of eligible voting age in SD is 88%—a huge percentage compared to other states.

Laurie Gustafson read a very nice Thank You from LaDonna Zellmer regarding the backpacks and school supplies that our Zonta Club donated to area schools. **Approval of Minutes:** A motion to approve the September meeting minutes was made by Jo Riley, seconded by Anita Zastrow. All members voted in favor. Motion carried.

**Financial Reports:** The Financial Reports as of September 30, 2008, will be filed for audit. **Standing Rule Changes:** 

Jane Page presented proposed changes to three standing rules. These three standing rules with their changes appeared in the October newsletter:

- Standing Rule #3 Dues and Charges. Motion was made by Laurie Schultz to approve the standing rule change as presented; seconded by Beverly Lewis. All members voted in favor. Motion carried.
- Standing Rule #4 Area Meeting and District Conference and International Convention. Motion by Anita Zastrow to approve changes as presented; seconded by Laurie Schultz. Question by Denise Luckhurst regarding who decides and when do they decide there is money in the budget. After discussion by several members a change was proposed to add the language "up to budgeted amount" when it discusses travel reimbursement. Motion by Denise Luckhurst to approve standing rule #4 as amended; seconded by Anita Zastrow. All members voted in favor. Motion carried.
- Standing Rule # 13 Service Funds. Motion by Jane Page to approve standing rule changes as presented; seconded by Alison Jares. All members

Member *Marilyn Osse* has retired from her position with the Federal Government. She will, though, be working a couple days a week on a fee basis until her home sells. At that time Marilyn and her husband will be moving to Casper, Wyoming.

## **ZI Voluntary Dues Update**

The 2008 Convention approved an increase of US\$15 in dues beginning 1 June 2009. This brings the total per member international dues to US\$65 for the 2009-2010 fiscal year. This amount does not include the per member fee for liability insurance paid by clubs in the USA and Canada.

The Convention also approved a motion requesting Zontians to pay an additional \$15 per member to Zonta International as a voluntary dues payment in 2008-2009 in addition to their regular dues of US\$50.

To make your Voluntary 2008-2009 Dues Payment, the preferred manner of payment is a group payment by the club using a check or wire transfer (the same methods used for regular dues payments). Clubs are encouraged to make the Voluntary 2008-2009 Dues Payment. [Please note that this 2008-2009 voluntary dues payment of US \$15 is in addition to the regular international dues of \$50 per member for 2008-2009.]

In addition, on August 7 individual Zontians received an e-mail with a Subject Line: **Voluntary Dues, Special Message from Zonta International Finance Committee 2008-2010** as well as from Zonta International Treasurer/ Secretary Gloria Stootman Wristen detailing the update and links.

## Voluntary 2008-09 ZI Dues Payment

Please submit your Voluntary 2008-09 ZI Dues Payment of \$15 as soon as possible. Remember, members are challenged to make this additional payment of ZI Dues to assist with the ZI Budget since the retroactive dues proposal did not pass at the ZI Convention in Rotterdam.

Nelly and Jane would like to thank the Club for sending them to the District 12 Conference in Colorado Springs on October 3-5, 2008, as Delegate and Alternate respectively. They enjoyed meeting, greeting, and getting to know many of the wonderful women in District 12.

The 57th Annual Zonta International District 12 Conference under the theme of "Going for the Gold" was held in Colorado Springs, Colorado, on October 3-5, 2008. It was hosted by the Pikes Peak Area Club assisted by the other two clubs in Area 4, the Canon City Area Club (now known as the Zonta Club of Canon City/ Royal Gorge) and the Prowers County Club. Nelly Nord (Delegate), Jane Page (Alternate), and Anita Zastrow (District Board Member) attended from our Club.

Nelly enjoyed meeting a lot of Zontians and learning about the importance of being part of our great organization. She even had the opportunity to wear a Pakistani wedding dress. Nelly came back excited with a lot of good ideas. She also said "I am proud of being part of Zonta."

Jane attended a session on branding clubs. She suggests that we post our mission whenever we show our logo. Anyone around the world can look at those golden arches of McDonalds and know exactly what they stand for so ... let's get out from under our "crafter" designation and make our logo something that people can look at and know immediately that it stands for an international organization that works to improve the status of women around the world.

A major focus of this year's Conference was the issue of human trafficking—modern-day slavery. Since the evidence is mounting that no community is immune, Zonta can play a vigorous role in promoting public awareness once we have a better understanding of what it is, who is affected, and what can be done. Jane attended a session presented by two female FBI agents who deal with human trafficking in Colorado. They explained how women, both foreign and local, are being trafficked for sex and labor. We may even have some of these victims in our own community. The agents provided ideas of what to look for if we think someone is being forced into these trades against their will. Anita attended a session on Aftercare—Cultural Issues in Trafficking ... which was very enlightening. Cultural challenges are very prevalent in the Denver area.

On Sunday morning Anita attended the Memorial Service where, among others, two members of Area 1 were honored—*Jessie Evans*, Glendive member since 1971 and *Shar Wentz*, Gillette member since 2006.

Other awards presented during the final Business Session of the Conference were as follows:

- Membership—Under 40—Prowers County
- Membership—Over 40—Black Hills
- Travel—Billings (They beat our Club by a few miles!)
- Service—Denver II
- Angel Award (presented by Governor)—Sharon Roggy (Conference Chair of the Pikes Peak Area Club)
- [Liz Whitham, Public Relations Chair, also unveiled a special traveling banner.]

Raffle drawings were held and silent auction winners were announced. [Our Zonta Club of Pierre-Fort Pierre had receipts of \$98 (for our Club travel fund) from our chocolate and wine basket raffle. The winner was Nancy Billings Gerlock, the Canon City Area President. Thanks to everyone who contributed money or goods to this basket.
