General Membership Meeting Minutes

May 23, 2012

The Pierre/Ft. Pierre Zonta Club held its Annual Meeting at 6:00 on May 23, 2012, at the Hitching Horse Bed & Breakfast Inn on north Euclid, Pierre. This meeting represented the club's end-of-year meeting and banquet.

Vice President Denise Luckhurst opened the meeting and welcomed guests Anne Rolfe, Brenda Kramme, Gloria Bump and guest speaker Mayor Laurie Gill.

Installation of Officers and Zonta Board of Directors for 2013: Laurie Gustafson recognized and conducted the installation of officers, as elected during the April Membership Meeting. Board Members for the coming year are: Denise Luckhurst, President; Laurie Schultz, Vice President; Carroll Forsch, Secretary; Robyn Livermore, Treasurer; Vonni Kallemeyn, Director; and (not present) Denise Voorhes, Director. Officers were each given a yellow rose and Denise was presented the president's gavel and pin.

Program: Pierre Mayor Laurie Gill spoke to the group about the challenges and impacts of last year's flooding on the community and plans for the future. Mayor Gill noted that the people in the community are still hurting, a fact that is acknowledged by the local Oahe Recovery Team. Current estimates indicate the area suffered \$16.5 million in damages. While community officials expect it will take two to three years before things are back to normal, the goal is to make Pierre a better place than it was before the flood. Mayor Gill spoke about the short notice the community was given before shoreline flooding began and how the Chamber of Commerce stepped up to coordinate response efforts during that first week, before federal support arrived. She noted that federal disaster response officials are using what the community did as a model.

Following Mayor Gill's remarks, Jacque Storm, Zonta Rose Day Chair, presented the Mayor with a yellow rose and a \$25 check to the city of Pierre, for use in the community's tree planting effort.

Zontian of the Year: Laurie Gustafson read a commemoration, awarding Laurie Schultz with the Zontian of the Year award. Congratulations Laurie!!

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned approximately 7:15 pm.

Sylvia Schultz December 22, 1912 – June 9, 2012

Charter Member of the Pierre-Fort Pierre Zonta Club

Sylvia Gladys Knutson was born December 22, 1912, in rural Haakon County, the daughter of Anton and Olga M. (Tungland) Knutson. She grew up in Haakon County and received her education in that area. She attended Alfalfa Valley Rural School in the 7th and 8th grade, which her father donated the land for the school. She then attended Philip High School where she sang in the Glee Club, and participated in basketball and softball. She worked for Nobles Garage and Cafe in Nowlin for a short time after high

school. It was then that she met William Ross "Bill" Mostert, an accordion player, at a square dance. They were later married in 1933 in Philip, and to this union were born two children, Pauline "Punky" Mae, and Bob Ross. They made their home in Philip. In 1937, her husband Bill was killed in an airplane accident.

Sylvia continued to live in Philip, and raise her two children, as well as work with the WPA in the courthouse making men's shirts. She also cooked at the Winchester Hotel. In 1943, she started working for the Farm Loan Association, measuring maps and aerial photos. Later that year, she was offered a position in Pierre. Sylvia and the kids moved to Pierre where they lived on the top floor of the Locke Hotel. While in Pierre, she met a service man named Matthew Nolz, and were married in 1947. Sylvia worked for the Superintendent of Schools and later worked in the office of the hotel. They then moved to Ohio for a short time after her children were out of high school. They moved back to Pierre where they managed both the Locke and St. Charles Hotel. Her husband Matt died on January 31, 1965. After Matt's death, Sylvia moved to California for five years before returning to Pierre. She took a job at the City Auditors Office as a bookkeeper and office manager in the State Publishing Company. It was there that she met Philip Schultz. They were later married on November 8, 1980. They made their home in Pierre, and Sylvia continued to work for the Publishing Company. In March of 1983, her husband Philip died of cancer.

Sylvia continued to live in Pierre, and in 1986, retired from the Publishing Company. In 2004, she moved to Brookings to be closer to her daughter Pauline and her family, where she has since resided. Sylvia was most thankful for her relatives and friends. Throughout her life, she learned patience and how to survive during the tough times. She will be missed by all that knew her.

Grateful for having shared her life include her son Bob Mostert and his wife Patty of Vienna, Virginia; a daughter Pauline Earley and Dennis I. Johnson of Brookings; eight grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; one great-great-granddaughter; one sister Lillian Perry of Seattle, Washington; several nieces and nephews; and a host of other relatives and friends.

Sylvia was preceded in death by her first husband William Mostert; her second husband Matthew Nolz; her third husband Philip Schultz; her parents Anton and Olga M. (Tungland) Knutson; a son-in-law Loren Earley; a granddaughter Julie Mostert; a grandson Kyle Earley; two brothers Luther and Ted Knutson; and two sisters Helen Culbreath and Alice Carr.

Visitation was held one hour prior to the services.

Funeral services were held 2:00 p.m. Thursday, June 14, 2012, at the First Lutheran Church in Philip, with Pastor Frezil Westerlund officiating. Interment was at the Masonic Cemetery in Philip. A memorial has been established.

Some fun Facts about Summer Solstice -

Did you know?

- Solstice comes from the Latin bases, 'sol' + 'sistere,' meaning 'sun' and 'to stand still.'
- Summer Solstice has interchangeably been called "midsummer," even though it marks the beginning of the season.
- In ancient China, Summer Solstice was a time to honor the feminine and the earth - the yin forces. The yang forces masculinity and the heavens - received their due at Winter Solstice.
- Ancient Pagans believed that Midsummer was rife with evil spirits.
 To combat these, the Pagans wore garlands of St. John's Wort,
 which is used today as a homeopathic mood stabilizer.

In North America, Native American tribes held rituals to honor the sun and the Sioux were well known for theirs. In addition to dancing, the Sioux would paint their bodies in the symbolic colors of red (sunset), blue (sky), yellow (lightning), white (light), and black (night).
