Birthing Kits 101

On February 11, Sarah Hellevang and Evelyn Haskell will lead Zonta members in the Birthing Kit Assembly Day to be held at Gem City Bone and Joint from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm. This event is one of Zonta's most inspirational and heart touching projects. Brought to Zonta Club of Laramie by Evelyn Haskell several years ago after attending an international Zonta conference in which a Zonta club in Australia presented this project, our Zonta chapter was the first Zonta chapter in the United States to adopt this project. Birthing Kit Assembly days are now a service project in many Zonta chapters worldwide. Birthing Kits came about as a grass roots level, direct method of trying to reduce/eliminate maternal and neo-natal mortality in the impoverished areas of the underdeveloped countries of the world. Studies have shown that

women who give birth in unsanitary conditions are exposed to life threatening germs, and their infants are also often directly exposed to tetanus germs and die of that disease and other diseases that rarely occur if the conditions of birthing are clean and safe. Birthing Kits consist of inexpensive simple materials that are distributed directly to pregnant women through medical providers in their country. The kits are all consistent in their materials which are as follows, one piece of plastic tarp material that is about 3 ft by 3 ft for mom to give birth on, a scalpel for cutting the umbilical cord, string (or cord clamps) for tying off the umbilical cord, 3 squares of gauze, gloves and soap. These items are all folded together and fitted in a small plastic bag that is labeled with the Zonta chapter name and location. They are then shipped with volunteers to medical providers in the underdeveloped countries who

will then distribute them with education on appropriate use to the individual families.

The goal of Zonta of Laramie is to make 1000 birthing kits on Feb 11. These kits will be stored with the committee chairs and will be available whenever the need arises to be able to send them with the various volunteers.


