Zonta Club of Pierre/Fort Pierre combats violence against women

To recognize Zonta International's support of UNiTE to End Violence Against Women and to bring awareness to a new advocacy project, the members of the Zonta Club of Pierre/Fort Pierre wore orange in October. The club expanded its effort to increase local awareness regarding violence against women and kicked off the 16 Days of Activism with the help of the local volunteer fire department and their advocacy slogan, "Real Men Raise Their Voice Against Violence". The club will create posters that will include the firefighter's picture and a listing of pertinent phone numbers. The phone numbers will offer people resources they can go to for help or to receive more information. Posters will be distributed throughout the area, including area businesses, schools, gas stations and even roadway rest stops.

The meeting on Saturday will include a presentation by Jane Roberts, featured in <u>Half the Sky</u> for launching the 34 Million Friends campaign when she became outraged by George Bush cutting the 34 million dollars that was allocated for

UNFPA. Jane sent a letter to the editor of the *San Bernardino Sun* newspaper asking 34 million fellow citizens to join in sending one dollar to the US committee for UNFPA. Lois Abraham joined the effort and asked people to "send this letter to at least ten friends." The women thought their efforts would end quickly. The UN foundation gave grants to hire a staff to open all the mail generated by these two women. Donations reached two thousand dollars a day. By the time President Obama announced restoration of the funding in 2009, the two women had raised over four million dollars, and they decided to continue their work. In recognition of their efforts and accomplishments, Jane and Lois were nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. Jane can show us how to get an advocacy project off the ground, market and keep the momentum.

Zontians will also get the latest news from Governor Sheila Davis, Lt. Governor Marcy O'Toole, Advocacy Chair Jane Page and Foundation Ambassador Tommie Atanasoff. The program will include structured leadership training as well as a fun service project. The project? You will have to come to find out!
