As part of our Centennial Celebration, District 12 challenged each club to donate books to local libraries. The books were to have a focus on strong		
girls and female leaders. The Zonta Club of Prowers County accepted the challenge! We were very excited about the project and we went "all in".		
Our volunteer Chair, Tammy Benabides, is a high school Enlish teacher, so this roject was right up her alley. Because our club is county-wide, we decided		
to collect and distribute books to schools within Prowers County (not just one school). Tammy emailed the school librarians to explain our project and asked		
them to recommend books for their students. We received a long list of great books, so that was very helpful. Tammy complied the list and emailed our		
members. We then signed up for which book(s) we personally chose to donate. We collected over 60 books with 100% participation. After adhering the labels designed		
by District 12, we sorted the books and presented the school's books at their respective School Board meetings. Over 2100 students in our rural county		
will benefit from District 12's book drive.		
This project promoted improved the status of women in general, targeting school ages girls and boys.		
Zonta Says No:		
Describe your club's Zonta Says No activities in 2018 - 2019.		
This year's Zonta Says No activities were in the VAW category. Both the Prowers County Commissioners and the Lamar City Council signed our Proclomation.		
Our Zonta Says No banner was hung in a highly visible location and our three silhouettes were displayed in three locations where there is the most public		
traffic. We displayed one in the County Courthouse, one in the Lamar Community Building and the other the Lamar City Complex. We also posted them on		
Facebook. We received positive feedback from the community regarding our silhouettes. This year, we partnered with the Domestic Resource Center, which		

covers the 14th Judicial District. Our club, along with the Domestic Resource Center, purchased drink coasters which had the Zonta Says No logo printed on

them with emergency contact numbers. We distributed all of the coasters to local drinking establishments throughout the county.
