## Amelia Earhart Fellow Awarded Nobel Prize.

Congratulations to 1987 Zonta International AE Fellow Andrea Ghez for winning the 2020 Nobel Prize in physics. An American astrophysicist, Andrea Ghez, was awarded the Nobel Prize in physics for discovering that stars at the center of our galaxy are hurtling through space around a supermassive black hole.

Ghez, 55, shared the prize with German astrophysicist Reinhard Genzel and Roger Penrose, a British mathematical physicist. Astrophysicists now believe that supermassive black holes reside at the center of all galaxies and played a role in the formation of galaxies from the primordial soup of matter in the early universe.

Ghez, a professor at UCLA, became the fourth woman to win a physics Nobel, following Marie Curie in 1903, Maria Goeppert Mayer in 1963 and Donna Strickland in 2018. Ghez spoke by phone to reporters in Stockholm, discussing the thrills of her research and her hopes that this new recognition will inspire more women to enter the field of physics.

### Governor's Seminar

The District 12 Governor's Seminar was held on September 26 in Cheyenne hosted by the Zonta Club of Cheyenne. A gala dinner was held the night before featuring magic and music by Elvis.

Treasurer Jan Kirch reported on the District's finances and the Leadership Team gave an update of what to expect this biennium from Membership, Service, Advocacy, ZI Foundation needs, District 12 Scholarships, United Nations relationship, and Leadership Development.

The lunch speaker was Jackie Parker, Project Director, Strong Families, Strong Wyoming. She discussed the work being done with youth including: healthy relationship education; providing parenting skills; teaching financial literacy; career exploration; and teaching how to navigate social media safely.

Advocacy and Governor's Memorial Service Awards were both won by the Zonta Club of Pikes Peak. Congratulations to them for a productive and impressive year. (Please see related article.)

# Zonta Club of Pikes Peak Area Receives Service and Advocacy Awards

Several new programs put into place by the Zonta Club of Pikes Peak Area were behind the honors it received at the 2020 Governor's Seminar in September. The Club received both the Governors' Memorial Service Award

and the District Advocacy Award for programs it has implemented that fall squarely into both the service and advocacy categories. The newest project implemented in 2020 is Zonta Women in Careers, a facilitated panel presentation where Zontians discussed their professional careers in the following areas: financial services, healthcare/social services, insurance, entrepreneurism, and non-profit work. The panel aimed to educate, inspire, and promote self-sufficiency.

This follows a 2019 event that also focused on enlightening women about career opportunities they may not have adequately considered: Women in STEM: Exploring and Equipping. Both the 2019 and 2020 events described above were conducted in collaboration with other like-minded entities.

Other considerations in giving the awards included the Club's spearheading the local International Women's Day Celebration, its donations to its local safe house, its on-going involvement with the Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado, and its action trying to influence relevant legislation. Ms. Waesserling was born 1961 in Hannover (northern Germany) and studied architecture at the University of Hannover. Since 1994 she has worked as an architect in her own firm in Erfurt. Since 2011 she has worked mainly on developing solar power plants to forward renewable energy.

She became a member of Zonta International 2001 and has served in many positions on Club and District levels. As Governor of District 14 (2018-20) she was responsible for 46 clubs in 8 countries (South Germany, Austria, Hungary, south Tyrol in Italy, Croatia, Greece, Cyprus and Lebanon). Her main interest is advocating for gender equality and supporting projects to empower women

Ms. Wasserling says, "Solidarity among women to reach their personal potential as well as to stand up for gender equality in general and worldwide still describes our goals until today. The approach of Zonta to combine service work, whether on a local or the international level, with a long lasting advocacy initiative leads to sustainable results. And by the way it opens your mind for the perspective of different cultures and offers you friendship with like-minded women around the globe."
