Secretary's Report, Approve September 16, 2023 District 12 Board Meeting Minutes
The board reviewed the minutes from the September 16 and 17, 2023 board and conference
meeting. The minutes were unanimously approved on a motion by Whitham/Camina.

### Treasurer's Report Final Report for the Biennium, Investments, Bank Statement, 2024-2026 Budget

In Treasurer Barth's absence, Masters presented the Financial report. Discussion ensued. Master stated that finalized reports would be sent out.

### Committee Reports – Review of Club Presidents Annual Reports

Masters led the discussion regarding what each has accomplished.

**Governor -** the big thing that struck her reading the club reports was that we need people to step up to leadership. She felt it was the worry that it was going to be hard. Masters asked what was hard/successful for club presidents:

- People were excited to join, paid and then didn't show up.
- Members that resigned due to modernization of the club, didn't want change
- Great fundraisers & giving money away don't step up to the plate for service and advocacy, plenty of feet but can't get their feet on the ground
- Successfully at grooming, one member who took a project on and it was successful.
   Made a conscience effort to bring leaders along. A prospective member said it was too much work, the 'business' of the meeting structure.
- Take on whatever terms you are willing to give. The challenge was every other month structure, at noon zoom and at night in person. Finding accommodation for 40+ members. Clicky group within our clubs – bra burners & far right wing.
- Rapid growth and keeping the club together.
- Lack of exposure to how clubs work.
- Need diversity of members.
- Take people on their own terms.
- All the challenges of people; advisors that give their opinions but don't do the work.
- When asked what is required need a clear answer/definition. They need to know what they are signing up for. We need clarity of SOP for what must be done and when it is due.
- Bridge between what you make of it, what you want it to be, needs a backbone of guidance – not strict. We don't want to be all the same clubs.

Need a clear understanding of what the club is about and what is required. What the mission is and how are you going to meet the mission.

Discussion ensued regarding International bylaws and the need for change. ZI Strategic plan for what do clubs need. Until the mindset changes, we won't see changes to bylaws, however the strategic plan will continue to focus and help clubs.

Three Steps Creating Leaders

- 1. Creating a line of sight
- 2. Impowering Action
- 3. Planning Ahead

**Lt. Governor –** Sundberg's - theme was What does membership got to do with it? Everything! Retention of members, engagement, building membership.

### **Area Meeting**

The Area 2 meeting was scheduled to be held in Douglas, WY and hosted by the Converse County Club. In late March, the Converse County Club decided to disband, so I had to start over and plan the meeting in Cheyenne.

The Area 2 meeting was held in Cheyenne on May 3-4. Overall, it was deemed to be a success, although I was disappointed that there were not more people in attendance. (About 22 Zontians attended.)

### **Item Failed to Accomplish**

Failed to keep the Converse County Club alive.

**Area 3 –** Colleen Farrell – Area 3, terrible weather. Would like to help with the Parker club. There are 3 clubs with a strong presence. Clubs are increasing membership and have good leadership. Working on Governor's seminar.

All 3 clubs are so different. Four/Five leadership meetings with Presidents & Samantha, since January. Area 4 meeting had 40 signed up, even representation 7-10 from each club and board. Getting more and more participation from clubs at District level. There were 7 from Prowers go to Ft. Collins D12 Conference.

Report for District 12 Summer Board Meeting Greeley, CO June 2-4, 2023

### Area 2 Vice Director, Marcie Woolworth

As Area 2 Vice Director, I would like to preface this report by reviewing the current job descriptions in the D12-Policies-Procedures-2021-Final. It is my understanding in reading this manual the Vice Director

- Assists the area director to perform the duties in the area.
- Assumes the responsibilities of the area director in the area director's absence or inability to serve.
- Performs other duties as assigned by the district. When performing the duties of the area director at a district board meeting or conference, the vice area director is a voting member.

### From the District Manual dated June, 2022.

When I accepted the position, I was anticipating there would be more mentoring for this position, and I was excited that Judy Barth was the Area 2 Director since our proximity is so close. Unfortunately, that has not been the case. Judy has taken the job of D12 Treasurer and will be leaving her post as Area 2 Director. It was my understanding that Judy would invite me when she visited the various Clubs in our area, but that didn't happen. The only Club she has left to visit is in Converse County, WY. Judy assured me that she will visit the Converse County Club and let me know when that will be. My hope was that Judy and I could work closely together, so when I go forward as Area Director, I will be able to assist in the training of the upcoming Vice Area 2 Director.

### Work that has been done:

I have had the privilege of starting a new club, which is still part of our District. Unfortunately, the Sheridan club start-up was out of my reach.

<u>Sheridan, WY Club start-up</u> – I had been unable to attend most Zoom meetings or attend any of the functions due to my work schedule and other obligations.

Prior to our conference in Pierre/Fort Pierre, SD last September, I had sent an email to all Presidents of

clubs in District 12 inviting them to meet sometime during the conference and to bring along their Membership Chairs if they are also in attendance. Wanting us to get acquainted and to share with them my desire to be an advocate with ideas of obtaining new members as well as maintaining their current membership. Unfortunately, that did not happen.

From our recent Area 2 meeting, Dawn Bali is working to start a Club in Parker. This would be a better fit for me, and my hope is to be able to assist in that endeavor.

### Work that will soon be done:

After the Conference, it will be my desire to contact each President and include the Membership Chairs in all communication with the blessing of the new Area 2 Director.

### Status of Clubs/Membership:

- Of the 19 clubs currently in Area 2, we are down some in membership. What can we do to help each other to obtain new members as well as retain our current members?
- How do we gain more interest? Sharing ideas on what works success stories and what's not working.
- Have Zoom meetings along with the Area Director after the Conference in Laramie.
- I am looking forward to working with the Area 2 Director who will be replacing Judy as she takes on the Treasurer's duties to learn as much as I can.

**VAD 3 –** Gwen Fornia – worked on grants with Debbie, attended the club creator meetings, helping with the Parker club. Get the club membership committee leads together. Met with Lisa Rice getting innovative ideas; current president of her club, working on breaking the barriers of the silos.

**VAD 4 –** Samantha Bruzan – Good area meeting, 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row of round tables of learning, there was opportunity to get to each round table. Interactive and not getting talked at, sitting at a table with other people discussions.

**Club Creators –** Deedee Boysen & Sheila Davis – **Sheila will email her report**. Deedee asked that we complete/share the **Prospective Member Form** for the eClub and/or Parker club. Going to move to west Pueblo for the next club and are contemplating Casper. The eClub will be considered area 4. The eClub can be members in anywhere – they are focusing on the USA, at this time. eClubs can do service/advocacy, have speakers, etc.

**External Communications –** Tasha Bauman not in attendance. Elizabeth Whitham will be chairing this committee next biennium. Had a meeting with Deedee regarding club creation. Suzie with E club. Would like to do a once a quarter spotlight on the website as a Blog post.

**Internal Communications –** Renee Coppock – when she get's requests to send information out to clubs/groups. Has seen an increase of opened emails and click throughs. Attempt to get things out within 24 hours.

**Webmaster –** Suzie Nulty – maintains 11 clubs and district. Approach the web as a way to store historical data, contact information, meeting information, archive. 300-400 emails regarding Zonta – info@ emails – that she routes along. We have an SSL secure certificate. Almost time to redesign the district website – would like some help and money to pay for (approx. \$85 an hour, \$5k guestimate was bandied around, many ideas about driven software, club people that do this, people that we know).

Area 1 Meeting – I attended and made a presentation at this meeting in Custer, SD. Spoke about the current push back against women's rights, the ERA, harassment in the world of work, and denim day.

Area 2 Meeting – Attended and made a presentation at this meeting in Cheyenne, WY with focus on current push back against women's rights, the ERA, and harassment in the world of work.

### **Zonta USA Caucus / VAW Subcommittee of the Caucus**

While Ranelle Randles was the primary D12 Representative to the Caucus, I was the alternate and attended most of the Caucus once-a-month meetings. Ranelle has decided to step away from the Caucus for the upcoming year.

I was a member of and chaired the Violence Against Women Subcommittee. This meant I scheduled the meetings (held once each month), often set the agenda, and did a fair amount of homework to research issues to bring up as part of the discussion.


